Introduction to Content Creation and Personalization

3. Dynamic Content

4. AMPscript for Personalization

AMPscript is a simple code that adds superpowers to your content—like pulling in live data.

 - Short lines, like `%%=v(@FirstName)=%%` to show a name.
 - Works in emails or journeys.
- **Easy Examples:**
 - `%%=v(@FirstName)=%%` says “Hi, Sarah!”
 - `IF @Age > 30 THEN "Here’s a deal!" ELSE "Hey, young star!" ENDIF` picks a message.
- **Why Use It:** Does more than dynamic content—like math or logic.

Beginner Example: You write `Hi, %%=v(@FirstName)=%%!`—it grabs “Sarah” from your Data Extension.

5. Testing and Approvals

Testing makes sure your content works—like trying a recipe before serving it.

- **How to Test:**
 - **Preview:** See it in Content Builder as desktop or phone.
 - **Test Send:** Email it to yourself first.
- **Approvals:**
 - Send to a boss for an “OK” if your team needs it.
 - Set up in Content Builder > Approvals.
- **Why It Matters:** Catches mistakes—like a broken link.

Step-by-Step Content Creation

 - Set: “If City = Denver, show ‘Hi from Denver!’ else ‘Hi from Us!’”
3. **Test It:** Preview with a Denver subscriber—it changes!
4. **Save Again:** Keep your changes.

Beginner Example: Your email says “Hi from Denver!” to Denver folks—neat trick!

Step 4: Using AMPscript

Let’s try a little code for fun.

1. **Edit Your Email:** Open “WelcomeEmail2025” again.
2. **Add AMPscript:**
 - In the text box, type: Hi, %%=v(@FirstName)=%%!
 - This pulls “FirstName” from your Data Extension.

3. **Preview It:** Use a test subscriber—see “Hi, Sarah!”
4. **Save It:** You’re a coder now!

Beginner Tip: Start with just the name—it’s the easiest AMPscript.

Step 5: Testing and Sending

Let’s make sure it’s perfect.

1. **Preview:** Click “Preview” in Content Builder—check phone and desktop.
2. **Test Send:**
 - Go to Email Studio > Content > “WelcomeEmail2025” > Send.
 - Pick yourself as the audience—hit “Send.”
3. **Check It:** Open your email—does it look right?
4. **Approve (If Needed):** Click “Submit for Approval” if your team checks it.

Beginner Example: You send it to yourself, spot a typo (“Wlecome”), fix it, and it’s good!
